Admission and Registration Requirements for the Program

To be eligible for registration and admission to this program, the following conditions must be met:

- 1. The applicant must be at least 15 years old.
- 2. The applicant's proficiency in English must be no less than a GCSE certificate or its equivalent.
- 3. Completion of the registration form and submission of the required documents.
- 4. Payment of the registration fees.

What does the student receive after successfully completing this program?

If the student successfully completes this program, they will be awarded a **Certificate of Completion**. This certificate is equivalent to **one university credit** at Level 4 (first-year undergraduate level).

Why this program?

The Introduction to the Study of Sharia Sciences program is considered the first step for those who wish to enroll in the Diploma and then the Bachelor's degree program in Islamic Studies, in order to study the Sharia sciences in a systematic, academic manner.

The program offers the most essential knowledge a Muslim needs, and it also qualifies those who wish to register for undergraduate studies in Sharia sciences by equipping them with solid principles and a strong foundation from which to begin their future studies.

At the same time, it is a highly suitable educational program for new Muslims, as its content has been carefully selected and is spread over only one academic year, with scheduling that takes into

account the circumstances of both male and female students, especially those with multiple commitments.

Program Duration and Study Schedule

The duration of this program is one academic year, spread over 24 weeks, consisting of two semesters.

Students may choose **one** of the following schedules:

















Option 1:

Wednesday: 18:00 – 20:00 Thursday: 18:00 - 20:00

Option 2:

Sunday: 11:00 – 16:00

Note: Only one schedule will be approved for the program based on the majority preference of registered students. The final approved schedule will be announced to all registered students well in advance before the program begins, God willing.

Attendance Policy

All students are required to attend lectures on campus. If unable to do so, they must attend the lectures online via live streaming.

If a student is absent from 15 lectures in a single semester without an excuse accepted by the **College Administration**, they will not be allowed to sit for the **final exam** for that semester.

Absence excuses must be submitted to the administration via the college's email admin@birminghamcollege.org — either before the absence or immediately afterward.

Students must take the matter of attendance seriously to fulfill the requirements for continuing at the College, being eligible for final exams, and to avoid missing the benefits of in-person engagement.

Examinations

1. Types of Examinations:

- Midterm Exams: Held at the midpoint of the semester.
- Final Exams: Held at the end of the semester.

2. Make-up Exams:

If a student is unable to sit for the midterm or final exam on the scheduled date, or if they fail to achieve the passing grade in one or more of them, they will be given another opportunity through the make-up exam session in September.

3. Exam Eligibility Requirements:

- 1. Payment of all tuition fees related to the semester.
- 2. Not exceeding the allowed absence limit (15 lectures per semester).
- 3. A signed commitment to abide by the exam regulations.

4. Exam Format:

- 1. All college exams are conducted **online** via the internet, not in person.
- 2. The duration of the midterm exam is 20 minutes, and the duration of the final exam is 40 minutes.
- 3. Exam questions include multiple-choice, true/false, and similar formats.











4. Students must adhere strictly to the stated exam instructions; otherwise, the exam will be cancelled, and relevant regulations will be applied.

5. Marks and Grades:

Midterm Exam: 20 marks

Final Exam: 70 marks

Attendance & Participation: 10 marks

(A table of grades, GPA, and classification will be provided in the official program documentation.)

6. Announcement of Results:

- 1. There is no fixed date for announcing the results; rather, results are released before the beginning of each new semester.
- 2. Each student's results are sent directly to their individual college email.
- 3. If a student wishes to request a grade review, they should contact the Academic Administration to learn about the procedures for this process.

Tuition Fees

- Registration fee: £50 (non-refundable under all circumstances).
- Tuition fee: £750 for the entire academic year.
- Tuition fees for each semester are to be paid at the start of the semester or according to arrangements made with the administration.

Payment of tuition fees is a condition for the following:

- Sitting for final examinations.
- Requesting an official college letter or certificate of enrolment.
- Receiving the certificate of completion for the program.
